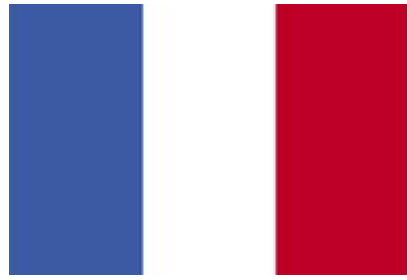

We are linked with Descartes School in Fécamp. It is composed of two different entities under the same roof: the lycée Maupassant and the lycée Descartes. Descartes is a vocational school which teaches 500 pupils aged 15 to 18 and Maupassant is a general and technological school which teaches 1277 pupils. There are 200 teachers in Maupassant and 70 in Descartes.

The variety of subjects taught allows students a wide choice from Maths, Physics and Science (baccalauréat S) to Languages and Literature (baccalauréat L), to Economics (baccalauréat ES) to technological and industrial subjects (baccalauréat STG or STI). The nearest equivalent state schools being about 20 miles to the north in Saint Valery, to the south in Montivilliers and to the east in Yvetot, our students come from a 20 miles radius from Fécamp.

Lessons are from Monday morning to Saturday morning, with most students being free on Wednesday afternoon (often a moment dedicated to sports activities and competitions). Lessons are 8 to 5.30 with an hour and a half for lunch. There is a canteen on the premises which serves about 1,000 hot meals every day. There is also a small number of students who are boarders and who spend the whole week in the school, only going home for the weekend. The school is also dedicated to the integration of handicapped people, currently schooling young people with varying degrees of handicap. Each handicapped student is appointed a personal helper who accompanies them throughout the day, including lessons and serves as a support person.
