







# PREPARATION FOR THE HISTORY EXAMS

Each week you need to set yourself a target. The following is a menu of ideas and choices to help you create your weekly target. Use the REVISION CHECKLIST to make sure you have covered all the content and that you have practiced the exam questions using a range of different exemplar questions.

The most important revision technique is REPETITION! Think about how you learnt to ride a bike....you fell off a lot before you mastered it! It is the same with revision you have to cover it again and again before it sticks!

Research suggests that you need to repeat information at least 5 times before it sticks.
